Co-scholastic activities and Celebrations:

Physical education and sports:

A reckoning competition which came in the forefront was AHPS mega competition, wherein the students were taken to Delhi to compete with 120+ AHPS schools in varied area of sports, literary, and cultural.

Olympiads:

Moving towards competitive achievements, we are proud to say our students participated in AHPS Olympiad and SOF and came out successfully qualifying for the next level.

Khelo India:

Teachers were given an insight on Fit India training programs and the regional games are played by teachers and students.

We are even delighted to share that AHPS hosted the prestigious AHPS Interstate Sports Competitions. Students from around 25 AHPS schools participated in sports, cultural and fine arts. Our students stood winners of 6 gold medals, 10 silver medals and 10 bronze medals. We have consolidated the sports activities on all days where the school has tied up with professional coaches at national level for Basket Ball, Volley ball, Throw ball, Lawn Tennis, Athletics, Skating and Kungfu to coach our children. These specially trained coaches are playing / coaching at many national events in the country and are training our students. The sports program helped us in identifying talent and give more training in a particular sport of their interest.

Investiture ceremony:

We went ahead with Investiture ceremony in which we elected our first school cabinet. The school is divided into four houses; Innovators, Progressors, Motivators and Achievers. The groups are led by Captains and Vice- Captains and the school is led by Head boy, Head girl, and Literary, Cultural, Sports and Discipline secretaries.

School Assemblies:

School assemblies provide ample opportunities for all our students to come forth with self-courage and express their abilities of public speaking, reading, thought and knowledge sharing, etc. It is considered as a highly effective mode of confidence building platform.

Clubs:

We also have a flagship forum dedicated to study of interest in students in particular areas where they have more interest through Literary Club, Maths Club, Cultural Club, Science Club, Arts And Crafts, Yoga Club, Reading Club etc.
